General Information:

STAY HOME! The Governor issued a stay at home order for all nonessential workers in the State of Vermont. Please abide by the State's directive and do not travel outside of your home unless 150% necessary. CoVid-19 cases are still on the rise, Addison County boarders New York—the CoVid-19 epicenter, and we have an older and more vulnerable population than others. Please do your part to stop the spread and save a life!

Main Street Paving Project: The Main Street Paving Project in Downtown Vergennes and Bristol that was slated for an April 1st start date has been postponed until the Executive Order is lifted.

Shaws: Every Tuesday and Thursday from 7 AM to 9 AM, Shaws restricts shopping for the elderly only.

Sewer/Septic: Only flush toilet paper. Please do not clog sewer/septic systems by flushing paper towels or other non-dissolvable products down the drain.

Municipal Government Information:

Meetings: Due to the Governor's Stay at Home Order, municipalities will not be holding physical locations for public meetings. Conferencing technology enables meetings to he held over video and phone, which allow for virtual public participation. Please visit you Town's website or call your Town Clerk for more information.

Day-to-day Operations: The City of Vergennes and other Towns have suspended all non-essential work. This includes many public works and City/Town hall functions. Vergennes City Hall is currently closed entirely to the public until further notice. A drop box for payment and document submission has been placed on the front of City Hall.

Vergennes-Panton Water Dist.: The Vergennes Panton Water District continues to provide the essential service of supplying potable water for drinking and fire protection. We do not expect water service to be affected, but all of the water operators will be practicing social distancing and following prescribed guidelines.

VPWD's office at 7 Canal Street in Vergennes will be closed to the general public until further notice. Any water quality issues can be emailed to vpwb.mainlaggmail.com and billing issues to maria.vpwb@yahoo.com.

Customers are encouraged to make payments on water accounts using banks online options. There is also a drop slot located under the first window of the office. Paperwork for a new hook-on or change of ownership should be emailed to the clerk or mailed to the address on the forms.
